

Let's Glow SF: A Spectacular Effort to Revitalize Downtown San Francisco

Let's Glow SF, the largest holiday projection event in the country, is returning to downtown San Francisco from December 1st through 10th,

2023. The free outdoor holiday event aims to draw people back into the struggling downtown area by projecting large-scale art concepts onto the facade of five iconic buildings, including the Ferry Building for the first time ever.

The event is hosted by The Downtown SF Partnership and organized by A3 Visual. It features a mix of local and international artists and runs for 10 nights at four downtown locations. The Let's Glow SF light show will run from December 10th to January 8th. The show will be free to the public and will take place nightly from 6:00 PM to 10:00 PM.
